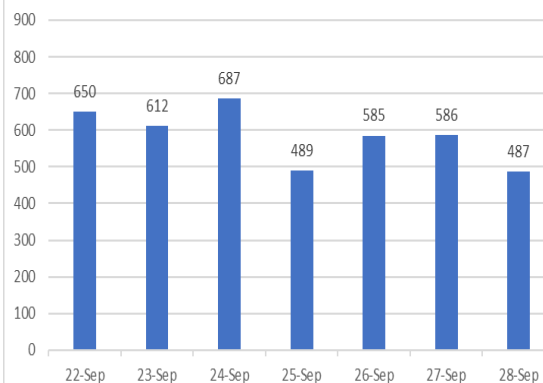

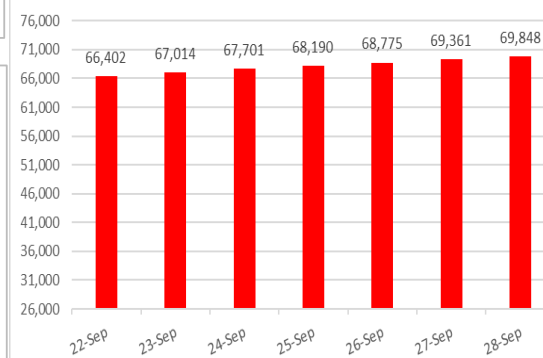
HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality were: a 81 year old male Bahraini Citizens, a 64 year old female Bahraini Citizens and 56 year old male expatriate.
- Government will continue paying 50% of wages for Bahrainis working in Covid-19 hit private businesses from October to December 2020.
- Speaker of the Shura Council praised Government's decisions for supporting the sectors affected by the Corona pandemic.
- Thirteen ministries and public establishments honored for their role in promoting voluntary work contributing to combating Covid-19 pandemic.
- Head of the East Riffa Health Center confirmed full commitment to precautionary measures to overcome Covid-19 pandemic and return to normal life.
- National Anti-Smoking Committee meeting was held yesterday at the Ministry of health.
- A study revealed that sickle cell patients in Bahrain who contracted Covid-19 did not face any major complications during treatment.
- A crackdown urged against illegal expatriate drivers after a sudden resurgence of fares touting, ignoring safety protocols introduced to stop Covid-19 spread.

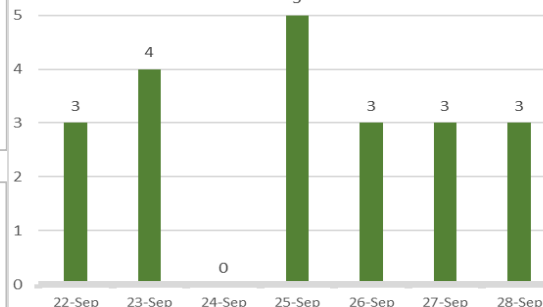
Number of New Cases
