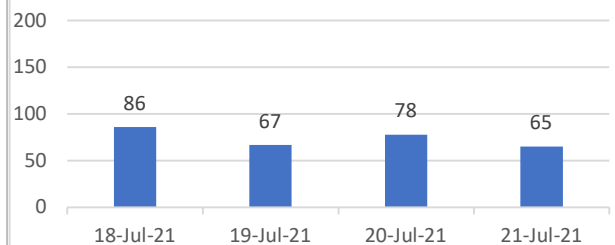

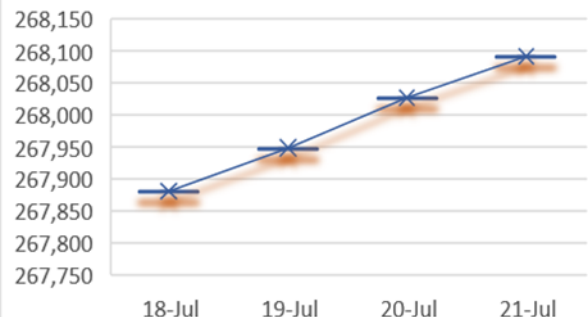

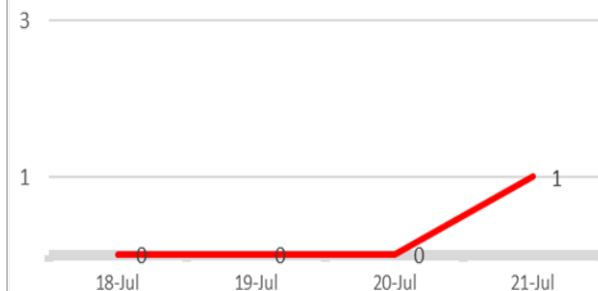
Number of New Cases
