## Situation Report No. 37- Kingdom of Bahrain

Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 20 April 2020

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Approximately 90,000 tests were conducted.
- 26 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 1,907.
- At present there are 1,127 active cases still receiving treatment, 2 of them in critical condition, and 773 individuals were discharged.
- No new mortality and no community transmission recorded.
- Repatriation Programme continues with one flight bringing Bahraini's from Iran.
- To reduce density in housing of workers in Central Manama, expatriate workers were moved to temporary housing in "Ain Adhari Park".
- Symbolic presence in Al-Fateh Mosque (Imam + 5 worshipers) will be allowed during Friday prayer, Isha and Taraweeh to allow broadcasting of the prayers through audio-visual media.
- "Bahrain International Circuit" engineers design a new breathing aid for non-ICU patients.
- Bahrain orders government agencies to cut spending by 30 percent amid economic fallout caused by the coronavirus.
- Hotline 444 for reporting new or suspected cases.

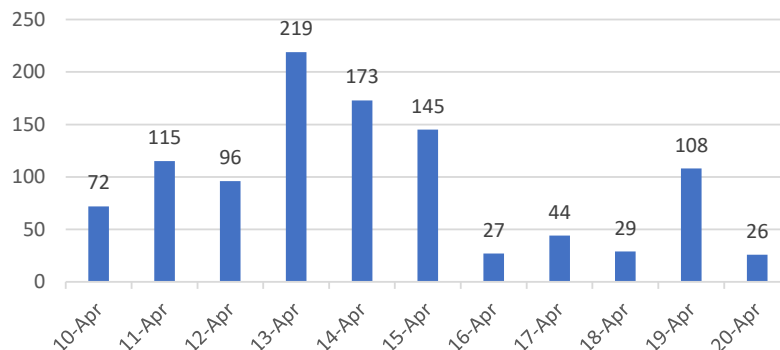
