## Situation Report No. 39- Kingdom of Bahrain

Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 22 April 2020

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Approximately 97,800 tests were conducted.
- 54 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 2,027 .
- At present there are 994 active cases still receiving treatment, 2 of them in critical condition, while 1,026 individuals were discharged.
- No new mortality and no community transmission recorded.
- Eight convicted (in lower court) for violating COVID-19 mitigation measures. Sentences were all fines, ranging from BD 1,000 to BD 5,000.
- State-wide re-closure of malls and shopping centres effective 23rd of April.
- Bahrain extends closure measures for two additional weeks starting April 23 - state news agency
- Hotline 444 for reporting new or suspected cases.
- WHO's Ramadan guidelines now available in Arabic (see link below).
- WHO launches hand hygiene online course (see link below).

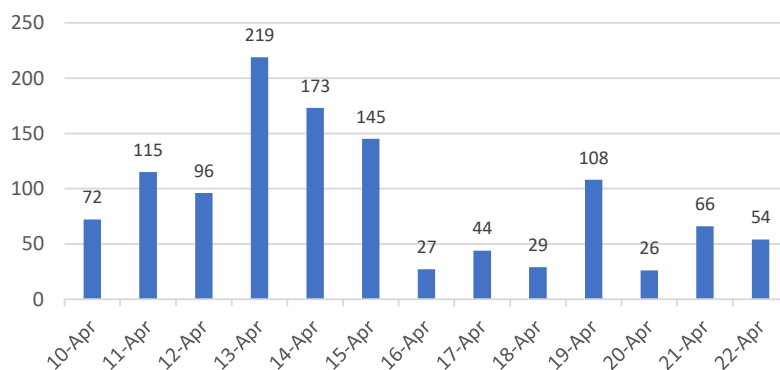
