
#### **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL HIGHLIGHTS**

- **COVID-19 cases and deaths:** As of 26 February 2022, 21 130 608 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 333 296 deaths have been reported in the Eastern Mediterranean Region since the start of the pandemic.
- **Epidemiological trend:** during the reporting period, in comparison with the previous two weeks:
  - The number of reported cases decreased by 49%
  - The number of reported deaths increased by 12%
  - An increase in cases and deaths was reported by 1 and 6 countries respectively
  - 10 countries reported a simultaneous decrease in cases and deaths

**COVID-19 testing:** The number of tests conducted has decreased by 21% in the reporting period compared to the two previous weeks. The total number of tests in the Region has reached 347 209 478 with a median cumulative positivity ratio of 10.3% (range from 0.6% to 34.3%).


- Variants of concern (VOCs):
  - 21 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Alpha VOC.
  - 18 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Beta VOC.
  - 6 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Gamma VOC.
  - 20 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Delta VOC.
  - 16 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Omicron VOC.

**Map 2:** Countries reporting SARS-CoV-2 Variants of Concern (VOCs) in the Eastern Mediterranean Region








# **Graph 1:** Weekly distribution of COVID-19 cases in the Eastern Mediterranean Region

#### **Operations Support and Logistics**

## COVID-19 triggers critical care and ICU capacity-building by WHO in fragile, conflict-affected and vulnerable countries

The arrival of COVID-19 has further exacerbated the need for strengthening intensive care unit (ICU) and critical care capacity in most fragile, conflict-affected, and vulnerable (FCV) countries in the Eastern Mediterranean Region. At the very early stages of the response, WHO provided medical ventilators and other biomedical equipment for the treatment of COVID-19 cases. However, avoidable deaths continued to occur, and high case fatality ratios were observed in FCV countries, with COVID-19 mortality following hospital admission nearing 100% in some instances.
