Grade 1	A single or multiple country event with minimal public health consequences that requires a minimal WCO response or a minimal international WHO response. Organizational and/or external support required by the WCO is minimal. The provision of support to the WCO is coordinated by a focal point in the regional office.
Grade 2	A single or multiple country event with moderate public health consequences that requires a moderate WCO

response and/ or moderate international WHO response. Organizational and/or external support required by the WCO is moderate. An Emergency Support Team, run out of the regional office, coordinates the provision of support to the WCO.

Grade 3 A single or multiple country event with substantial public health consequences that requires a substantial WCO

A single or multiple country event with substantial public health consequences that requires a substantial WCO response and/ or substantial international WHO response. Organizational and/or external support required by the WCO is substantial. An Emergency Support Team, run out of the regional office, coordinates the provision of support to the WCO.

An event that is being assessed, tracked or monitored by WHO but that requires no WHO response at the time.
