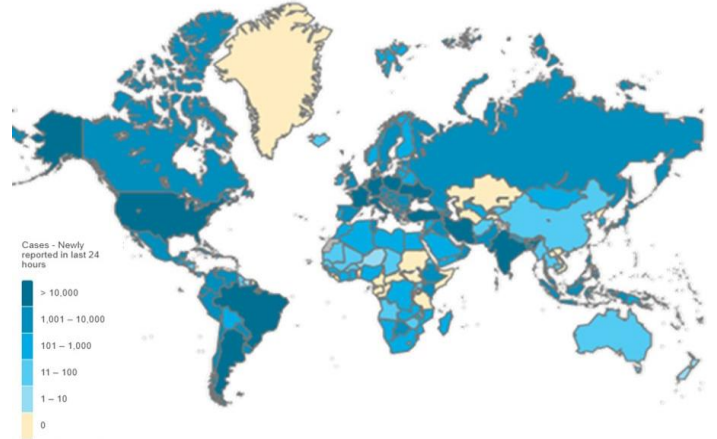

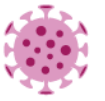

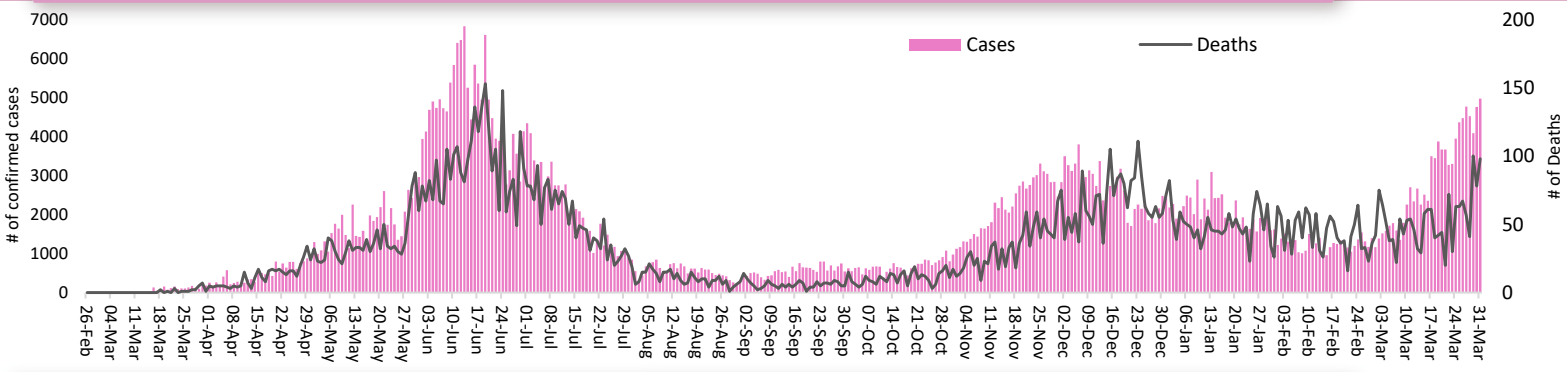

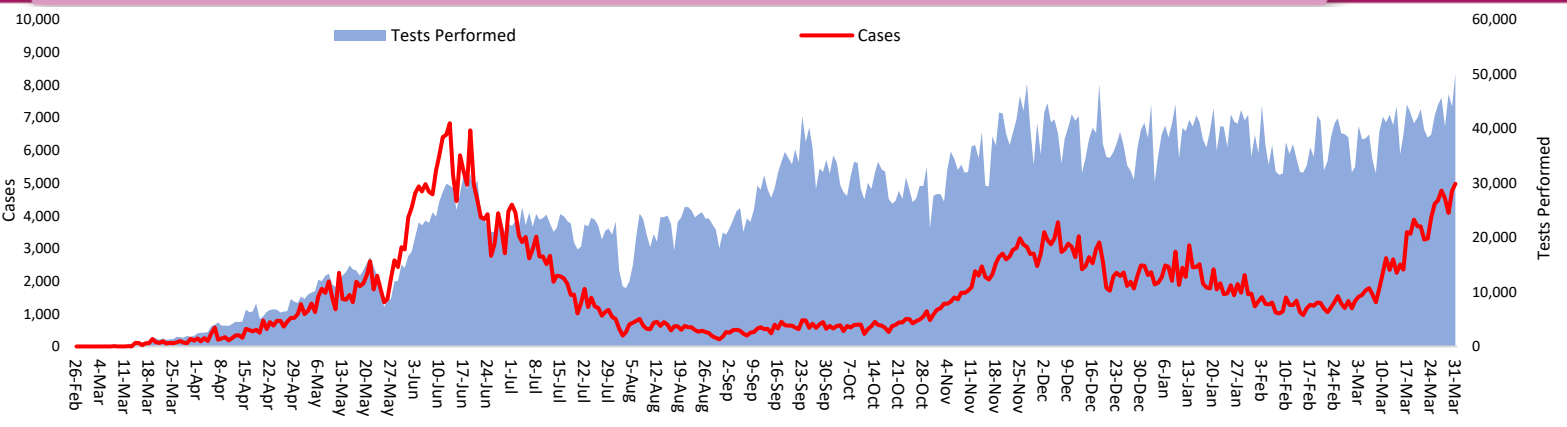

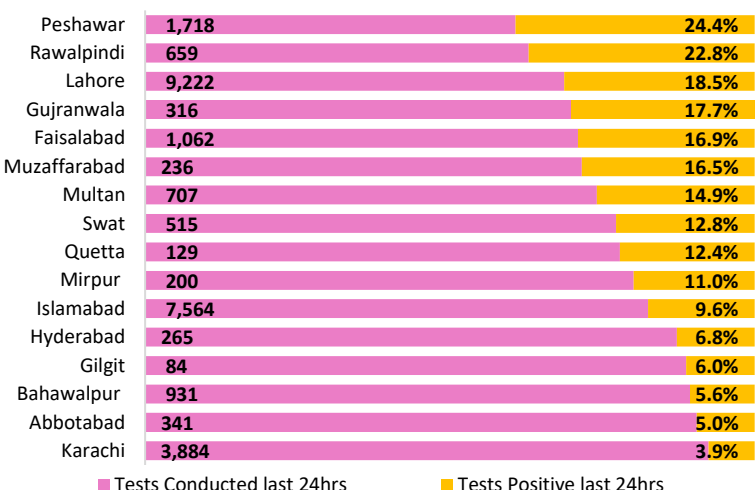
MEETING AND COORDINATION

On 30 March 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala attended the WORLD TB DAY event at NIH, Islamabad. The Federal Secretary MoNHSR&C Mr. Aamir Ashraf Khawaja, Executive Director, NIH Maj Gen Dr Aamer Akram, Deputy National Coordinator (TB) Dr Nasim Akhtar, District Health Officer, Islamabad Dr Zia Zaeem graced the occasion. While speaking on the occasion WR said that Pakistan is ranked 5th High TB burden country globally and there is need for key actions such as multisectoral approach, Strengthening Primary Health Care for Universal Health Coverage, wider engagement of private sector and involvement of communities to address the challenge of TB. WR added that we are running out of time - the clock is ticking. It is time for urgent action to end TB.

The Federal Secretary Health Mr Aamir Ashraf Khawaja in his address appreciated the support and technical assistance provided by WHO Pakistan for the COVID-19 response and for ending TB in the country.
