

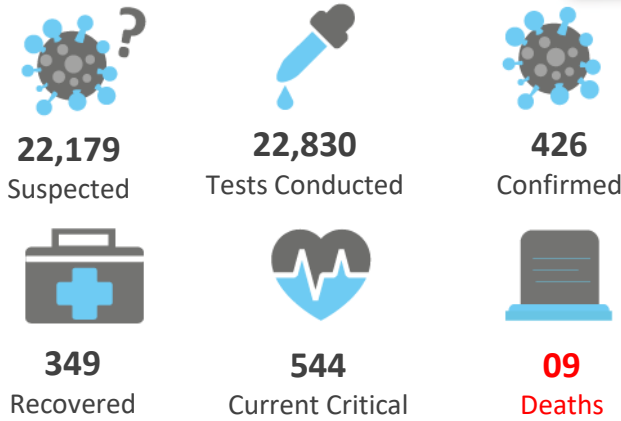

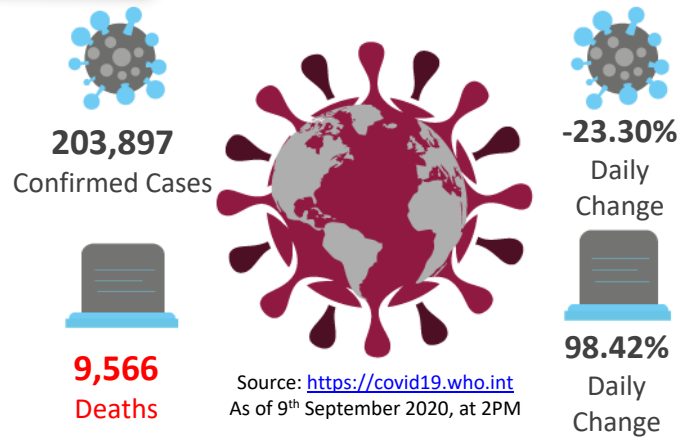

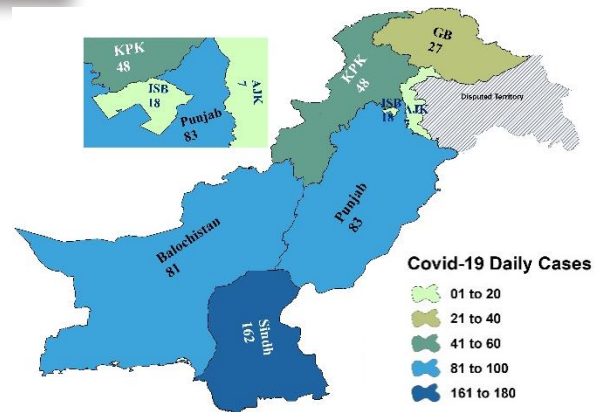

Executive Summary

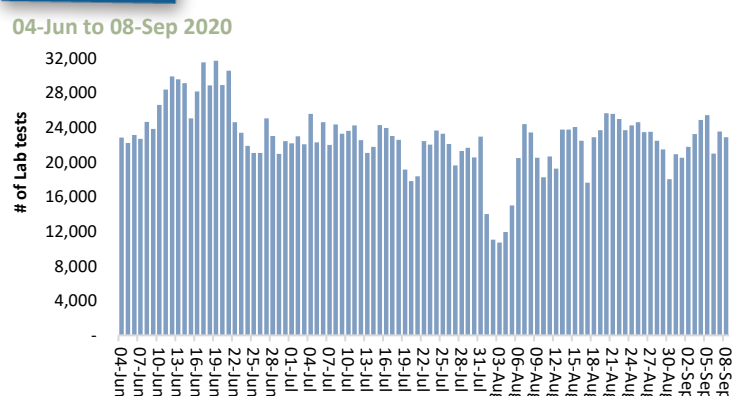
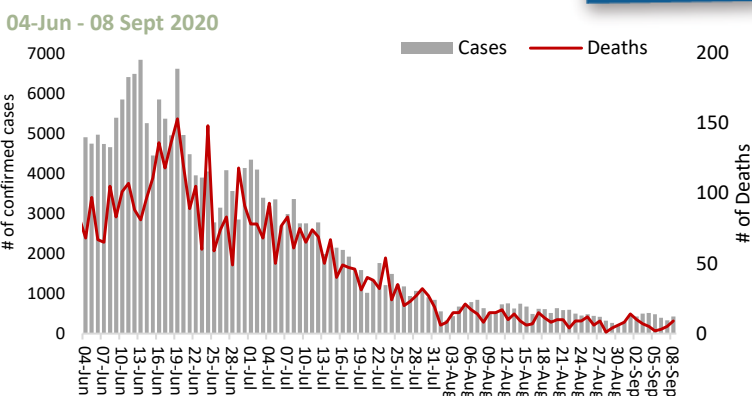
Daily Incidence by Province

Pakistan reported **426** new cases of COVID-19 on **8 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **299,659** with **6,359** deaths (**CFR: 2.12%**). Out of the total **6,794** currently active cases, **1,017** cases are hospitalized, out of which **544 (53.49%)** are in critical condition. **5,777** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **286,506 (95.61%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily Lab Tests conducted

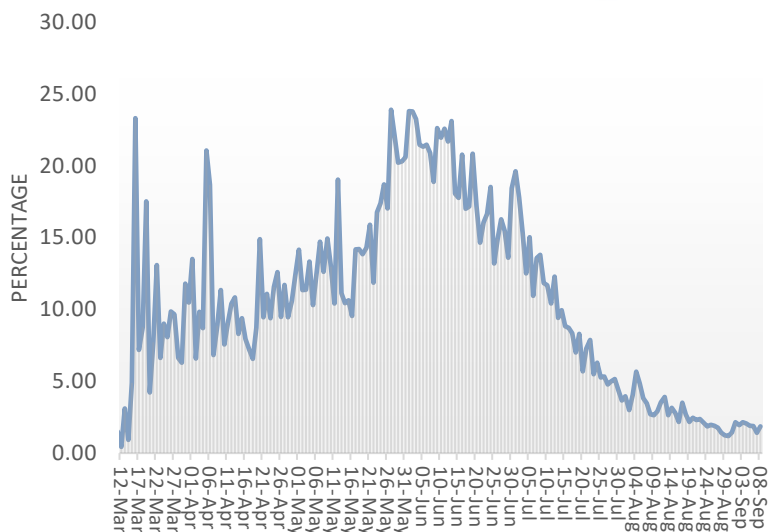

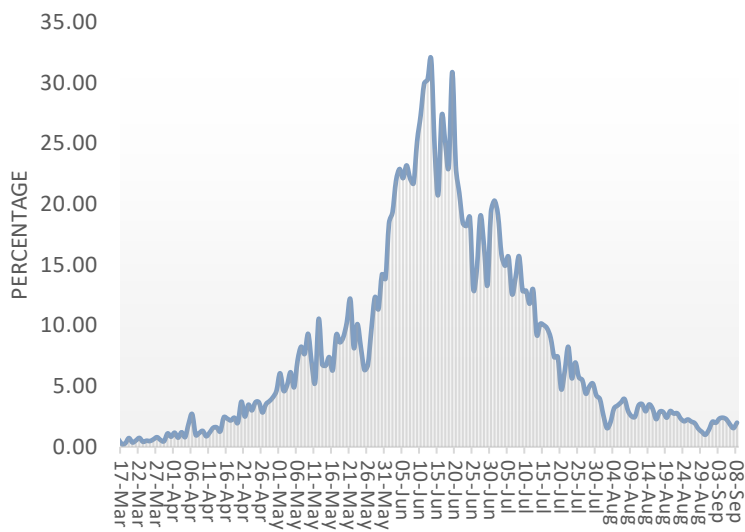

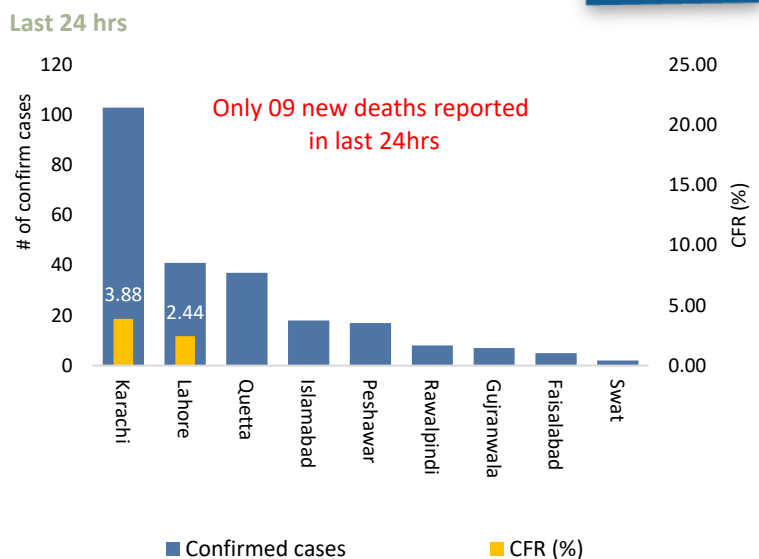
Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate



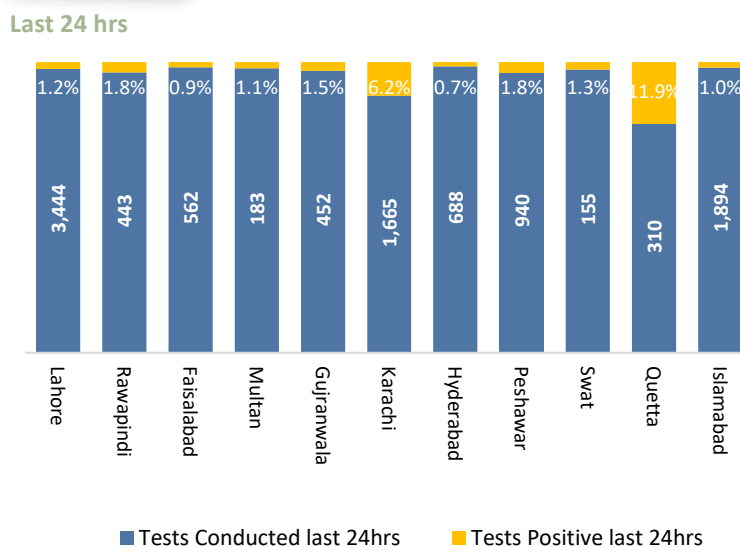
Daily COVID-19 Attack rate Per million population

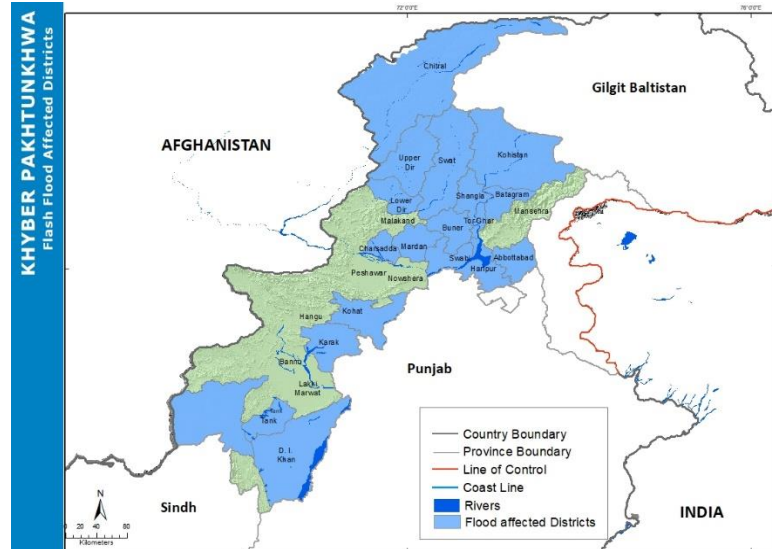
FLOOD SITUATION

Wednesday,
9th September 2020

No new incidence of heavy rains and floods was reported in the province of Punjab, Balochistan, Sindh and AJK. However, in the district of Abbottabad, Shangla, Malakand and Laki Marwat of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province; **1** new death, **5** injured, **10** houses fully damaged and **32** houses partially damaged has been reported (from 7th to 8th September 2020) according to the National Disaster Management Authority-NDMA

To date over **249** deaths, over **175** injuries, over **12,676** people have been displaced as a result of heavy rains and floods in the country. Over, **1,380** houses fully and **1,335** partially damaged since 15th June.

In response the government has created **32** medical camps and **56** relief camps in Karachi. See the table below for details.

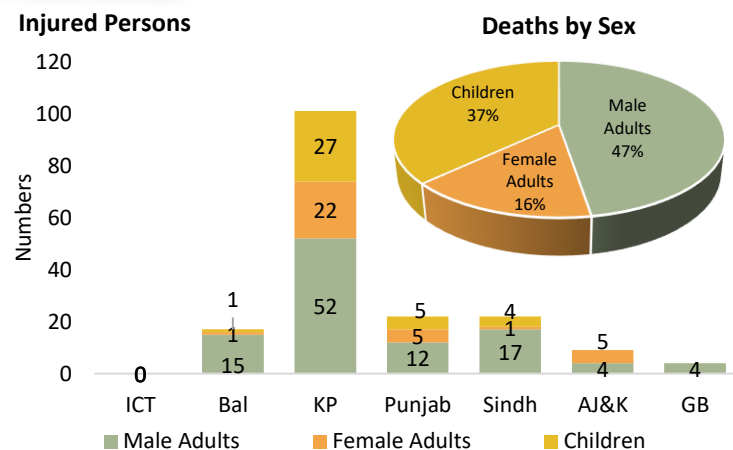
