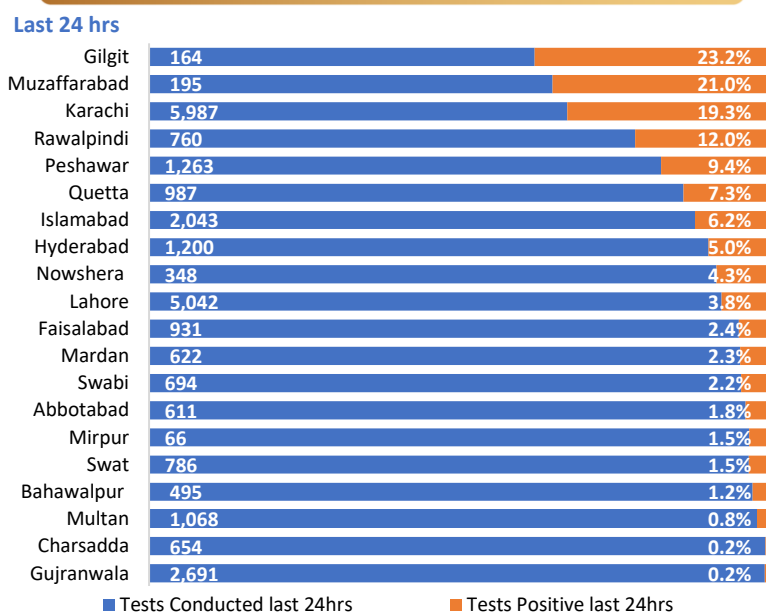

On 14th July 2021, Ministry of National Health Services, Regulation & Coordination (MoNHSR&C) in collaboration with World Health Organization, Pakistan conducted the 2<sup>nd</sup> International Health Regulations (IHR), National Taskforce Meeting in Islamabad. The inaugural session was attended by the Special Assistant to Prime Minister on Health, Dr Faisal Sultan and the WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala. The meeting was attended by 62 participants drawn from MoNHSR&C, National Institute of Health, Provincial IHR Focal Points and WHO Pakistan staff. The objective of the meeting was to review progress in the IHR implementation, challenges, and way forward.

During his speech, Dr Faisal Sultan reiterated the commitment of Pakistan to the implementation of IHR and noted that the COVID 19 pandemic has necessitated the need to evaluate the country preparedness and response capacities. The WR emphasized on the need to enhance IHR implementation through capacity building of health care workers, strengthening reporting obligations and undertaking sustainable interventions.
