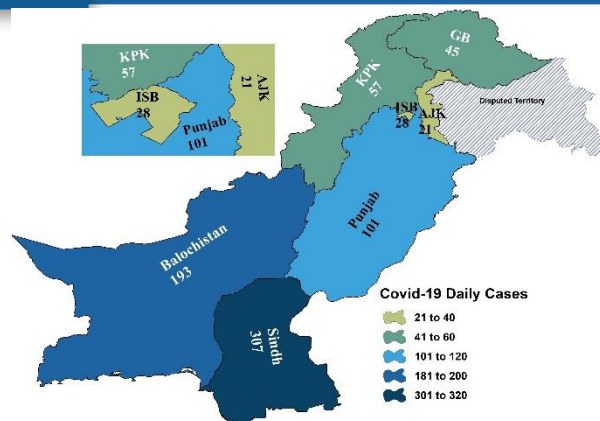

Executive Summary

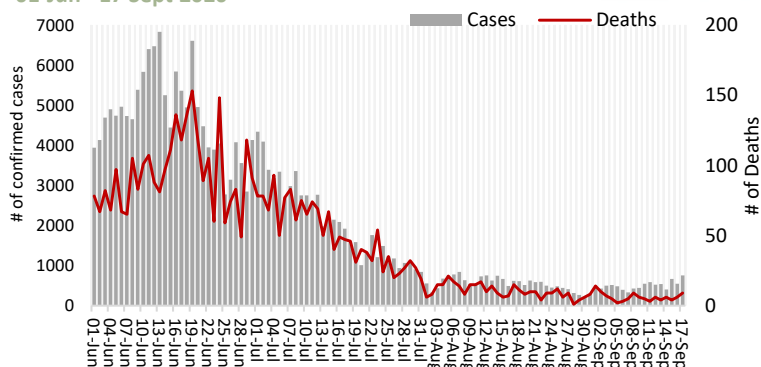
Daily Incidence by Province

Pakistan reported **752** new cases of COVID-19 on **17 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **304,386** with **6,408** deaths (**CFR: 2.10%**). Out of the total **6,295** currently active cases, **804** cases are hospitalized, out of which **579** (**72.01%**) are in critical condition. **5,491** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **291,683** (**95.82%**) have recovered and discharged.



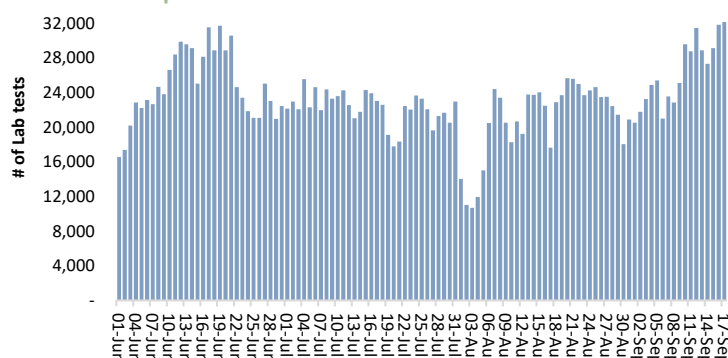
Daily Incidence/Mortality

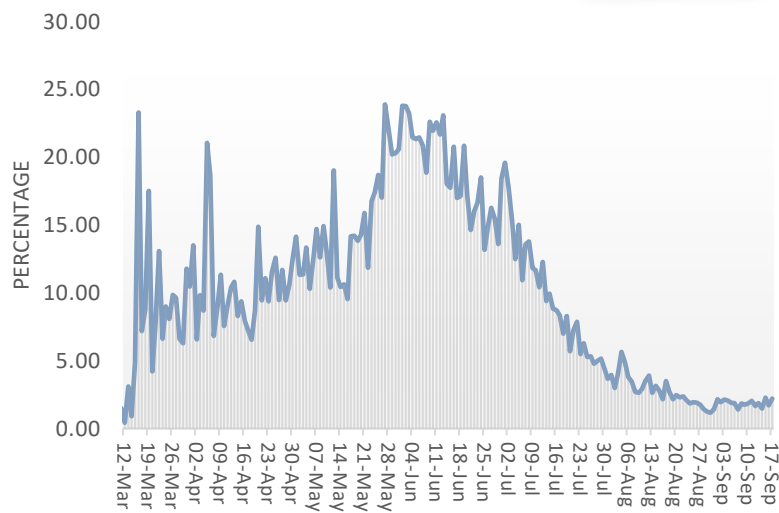

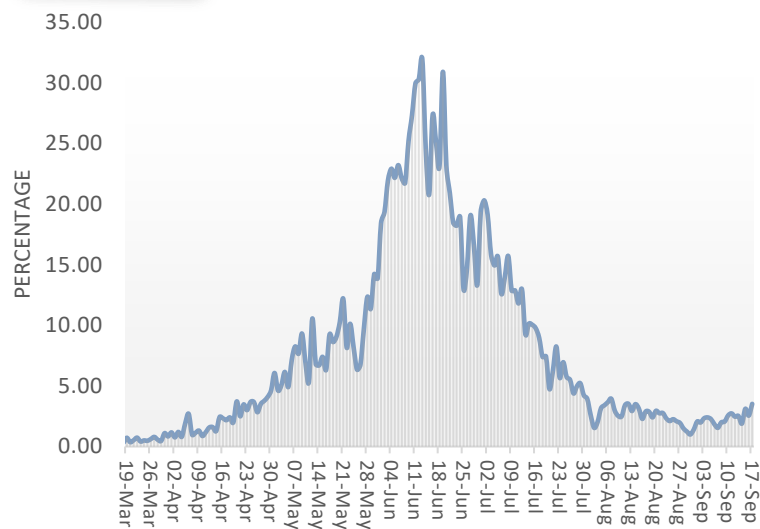


Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate



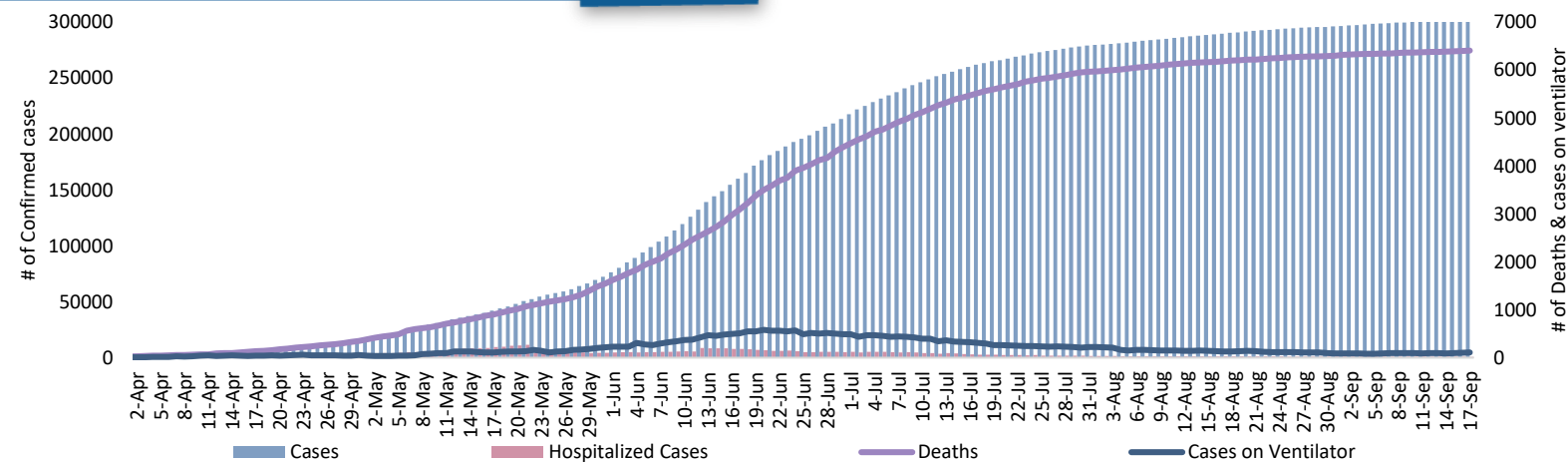
Daily COVID-19 Attack rate

Hospitalized, on Ventilators & Deaths



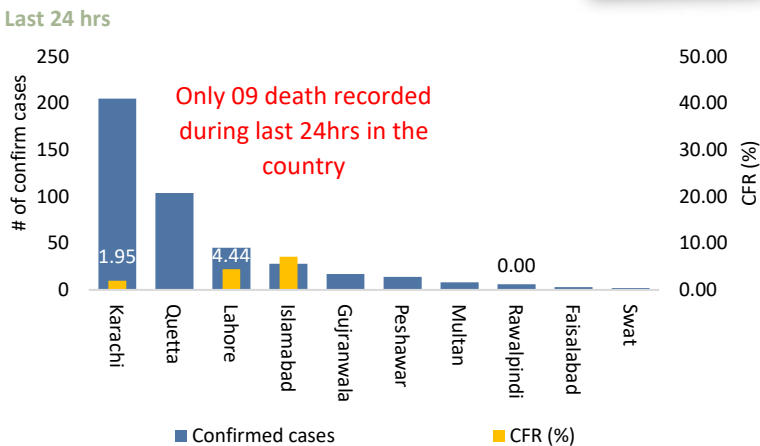

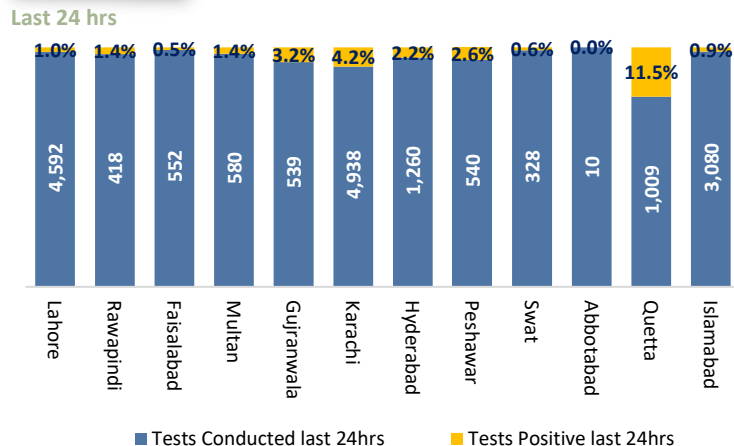
COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR

by Major Cities / Districts



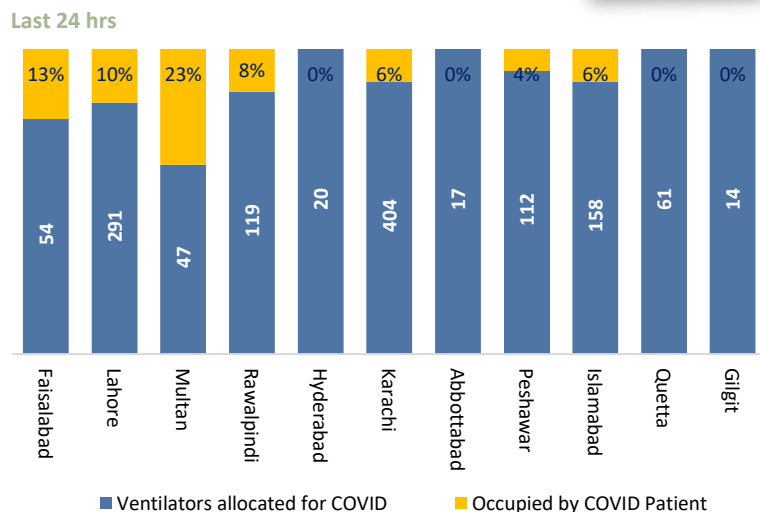
COVID-19 Positivity rates
