

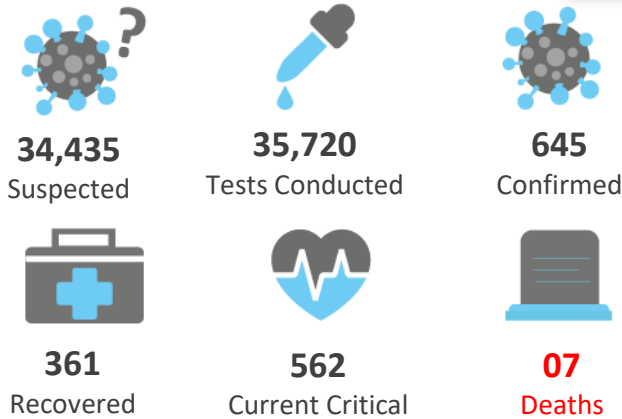

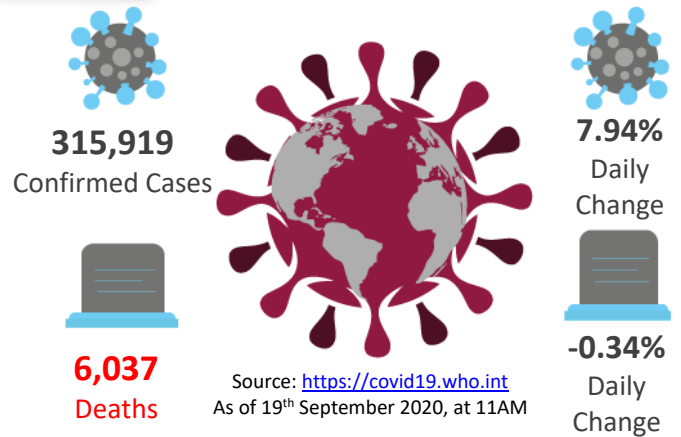

### Daily COVID-19 Pakistan Updates (Last 24hrs)



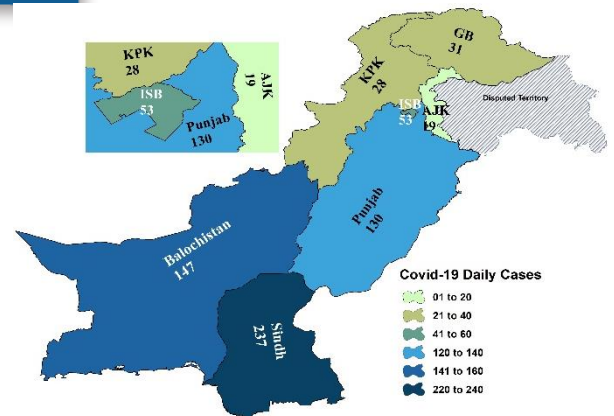

### Executive Summary

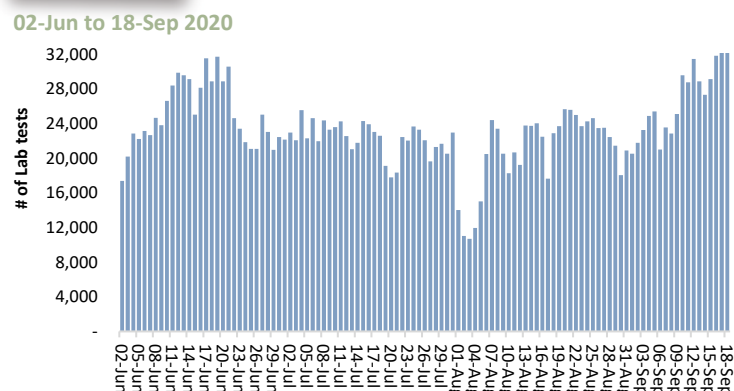
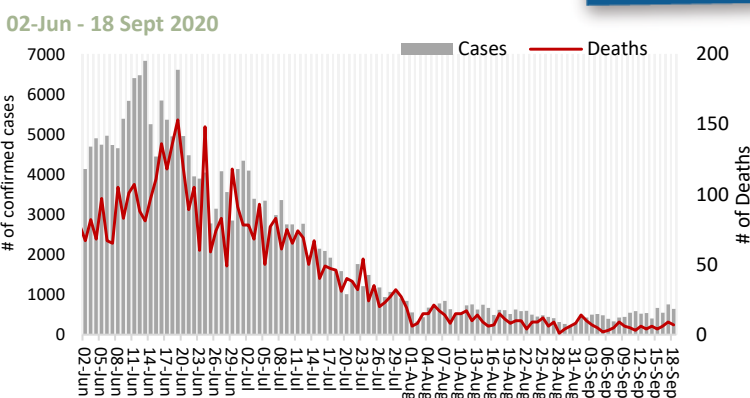
### Daily Incidence by Province

Pakistan reported **645** new cases of COVID-19 on **18 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **305,031** with **6,415** deaths (**CFR: 2.10%**). Out of the total **6,572** currently active cases, **834** cases are hospitalized, out of which **562 (67.38%)** are in critical condition. **5,738** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **292,044 (95.74%)** have recovered and discharged.

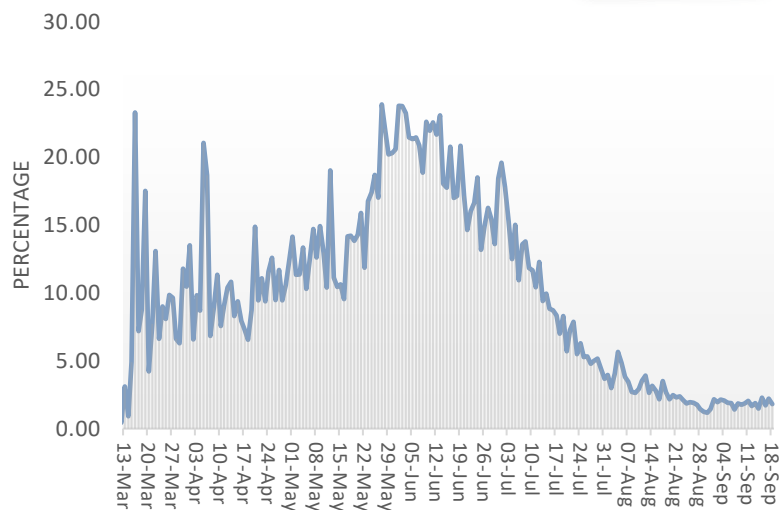

## Maintaining Essential Health Services

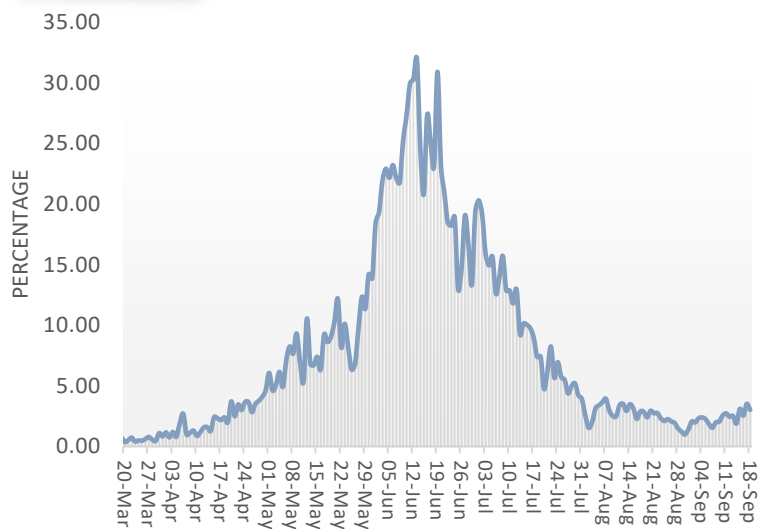
WHO Pakistan in collaboration with Primary & Secondary Healthcare department and Provincial TB control Program- Punjab on 17<sup>th</sup> of September 2020, conducted a consultative meeting on “Decentralization of managing Drug Resistant TB to district level”. This meeting took place at Hotel-One Faisalabad. Objective of the meeting was to discuss the Global, National and Provincial TB situation, causes and types of Drug Resistant-TB, treatment and implication of centralized versus decentralization model. Participants included Chief Executive Officers, District Health Officers, District TB Coordinators, Medical Superintendents, Chest Specialists, Medical Specialists, and TB DOTS Focal persons from DHQs of districts Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh, Chiniot and Jhang.

## Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate



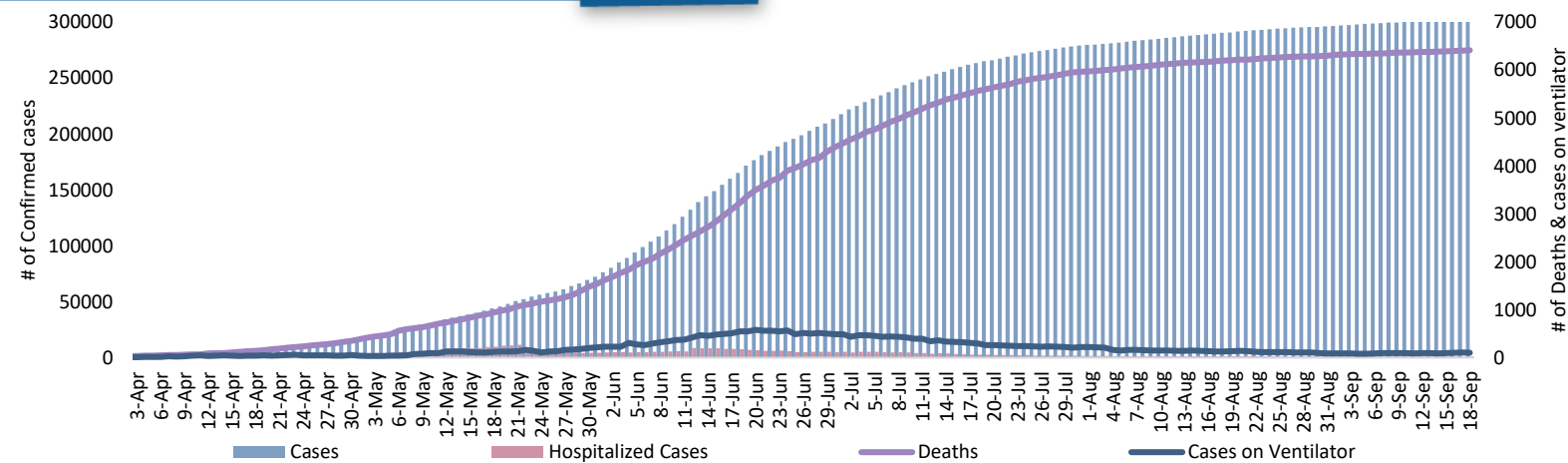
## Daily COVID-19 Attack rate

Hospitalized, on Ventilators & Deaths



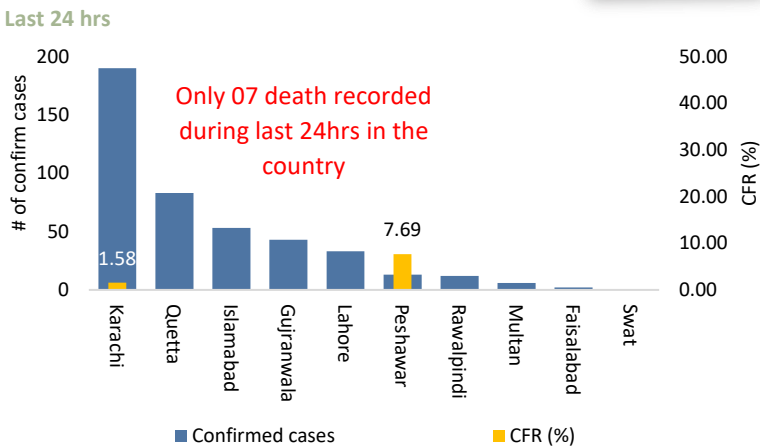

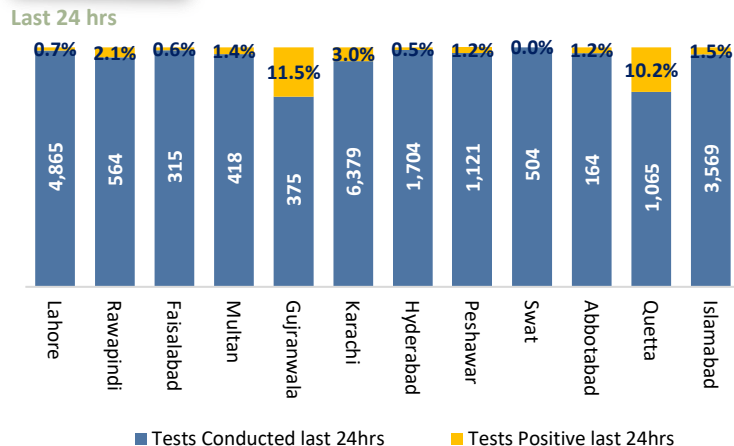
## COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR

by Major Cities / Districts



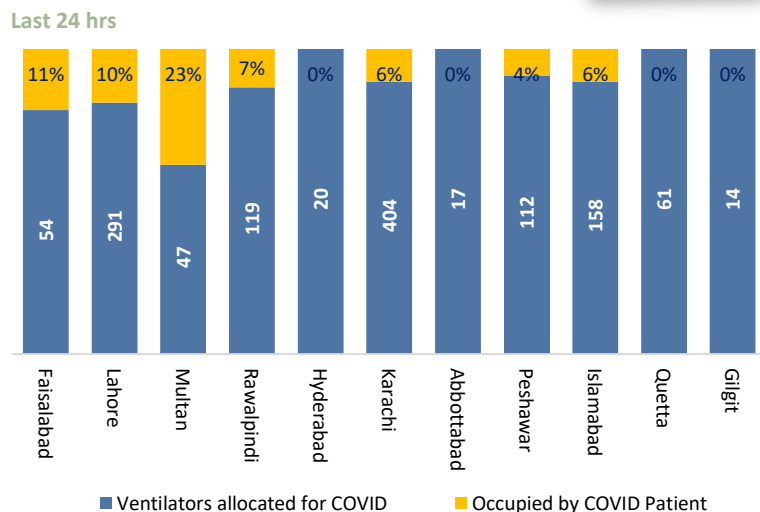
## COVID-19 Positivity rates
