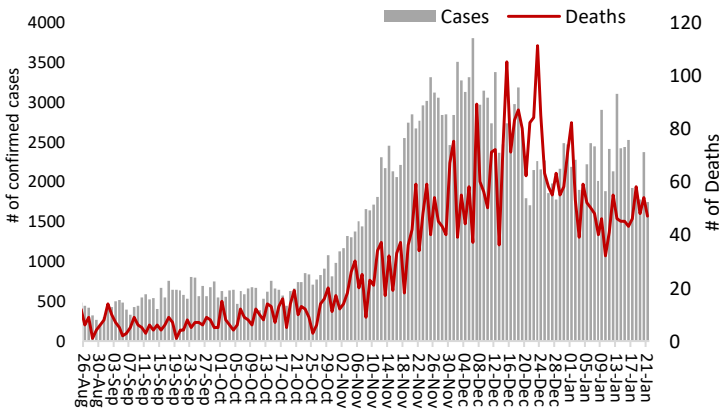

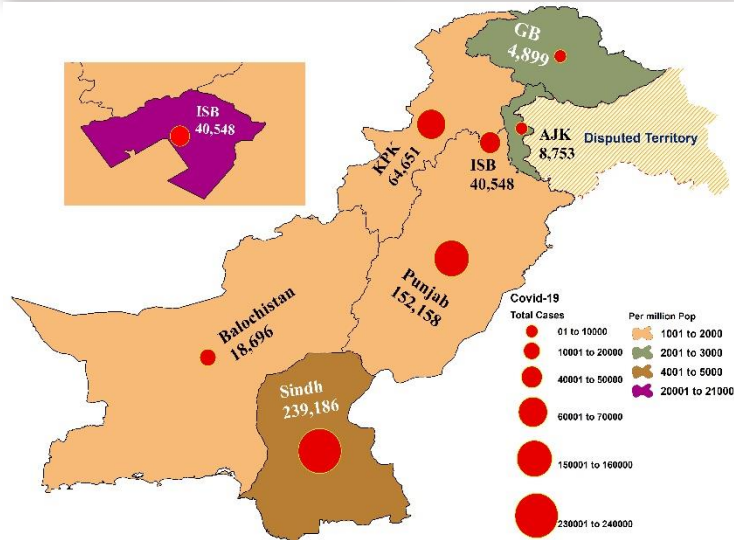


### INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE

26-Aug 2020 - 21-Jan 2021



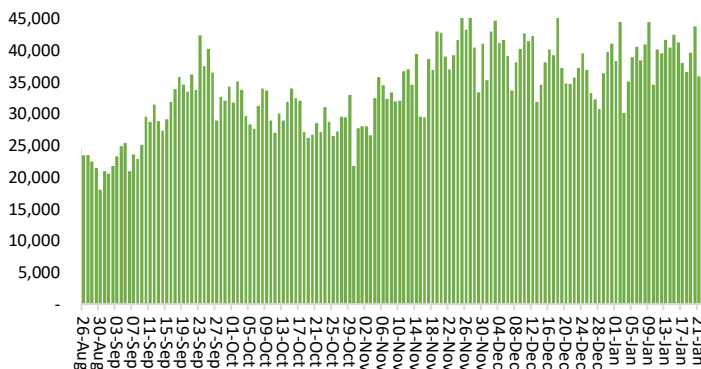
### TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



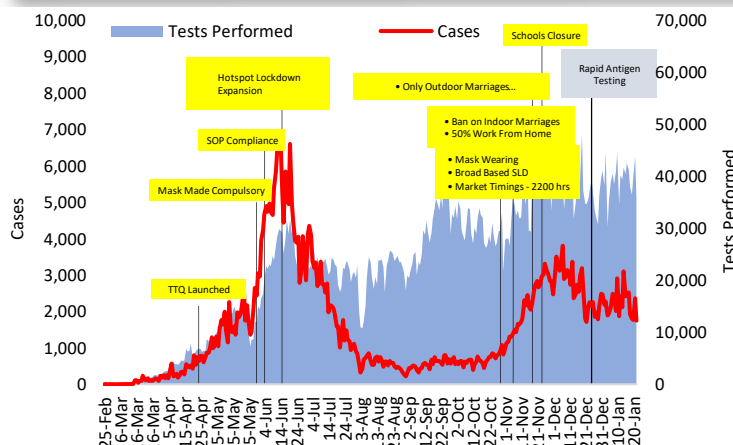
Pakistan reported **1,745** new cases of COVID-19 on **21 January 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **528,891** with **11,204** deaths (**CFR: 2.12%**). Out of the total **34,916** currently active cases **2,858** cases are hospitalized.

## MEETINGS & COORDINATION

WHO Country Office Pakistan in collaboration with the Pakistan Nursing Council & National Institute of Health conducted the first **“Certificate Course for Nurses’ Learning Resource Package for Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)”**, from 18-23 January 2021. Twenty nurses from all regions of Pakistan were trained as National Master Trainers. The IPC certificate course for nurses is developed as part of the strategic approach of WHO Representative Dr Palitha Mahipala, to invest in sustainable system building for standardizing IPC training and education of health Care Workers in collaboration with prestigious academic institutes and professional bodies in Pakistan. Speaking at the occasion of certificate distribution, Federal Parliamentary Secretary for Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination, Dr Nosheen Hamid appreciated the training for enhancing knowledge and skills of nurses on implementation of IPC noting that nurses are the bone of health service delivery.
