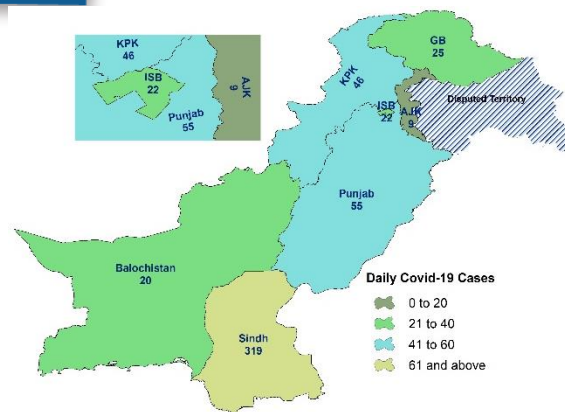

### Executive Summary

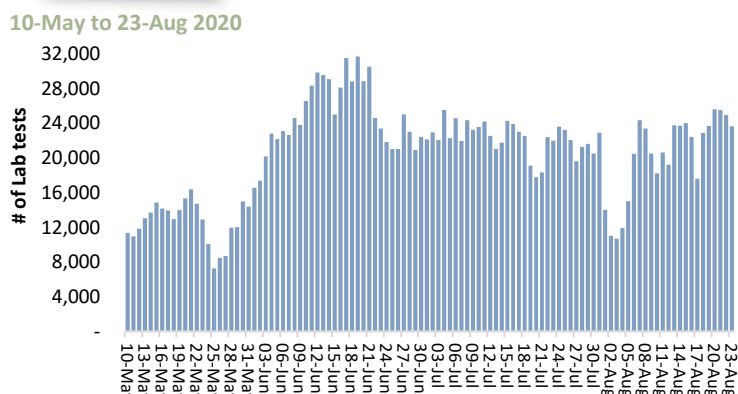
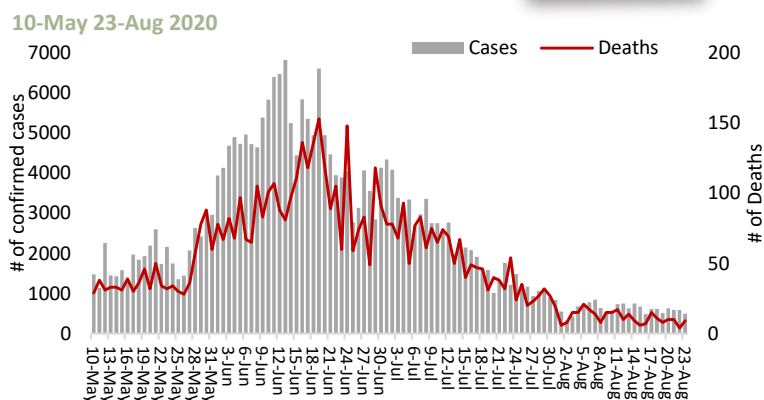
### Daily Incidence by Province

Pakistan reported **496** new cases of COVID-19 on **23 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **293,261** with **6,244** deaths (CFR: **2.12%**). Out of the total **10,188** currently active cases, **1,163** cases are hospitalized, out of which **686 (58.98%)** are in critical condition. **9,025** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **276,829 (94.39%)** have recovered and discharged.

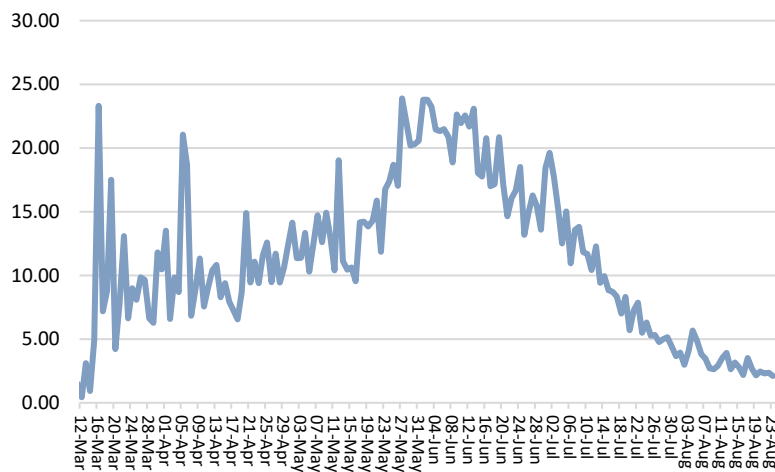

## Meeting and Coordination

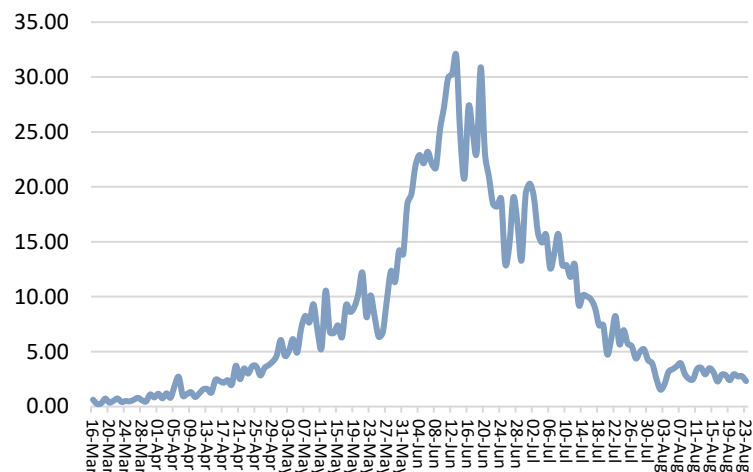

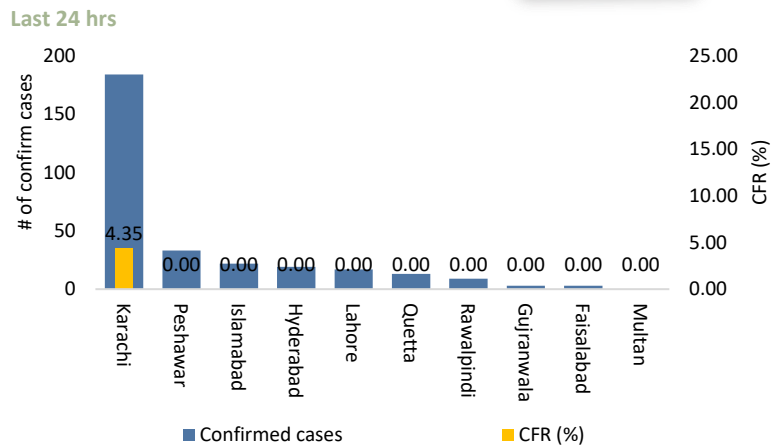

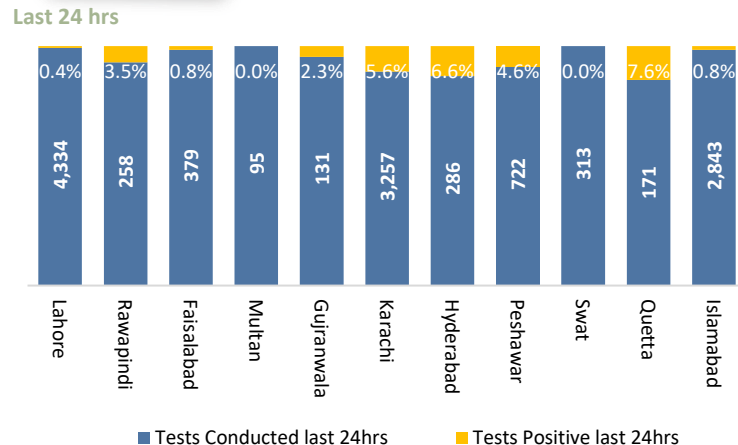

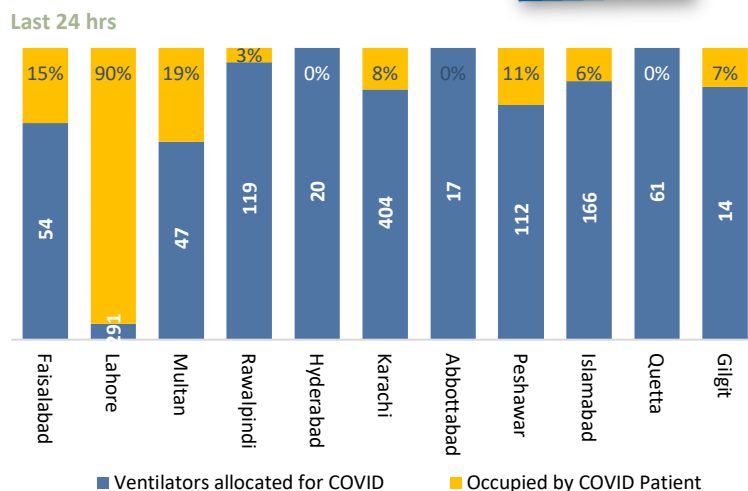
## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by Districts
