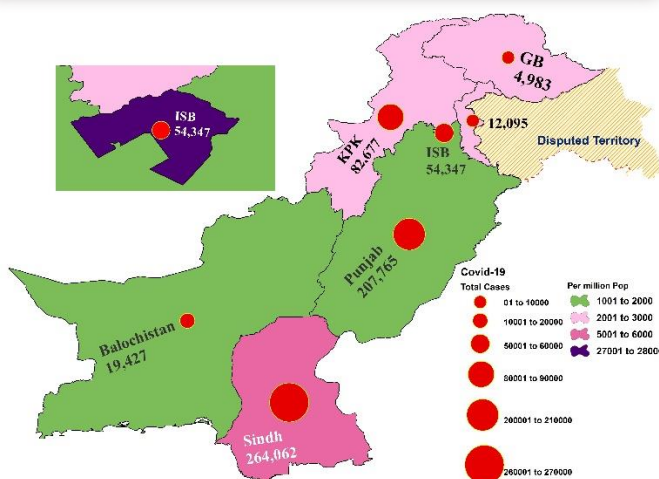

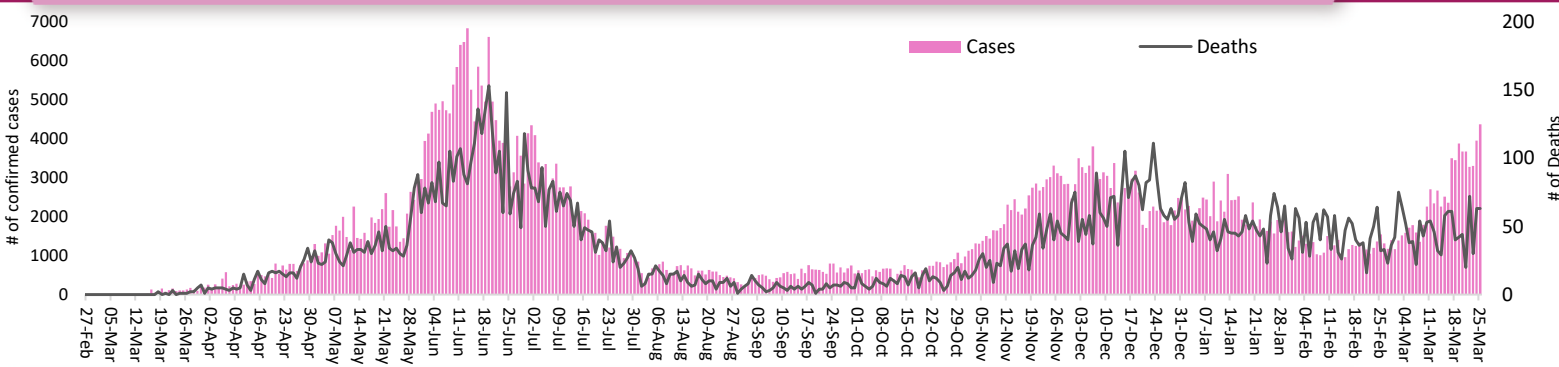

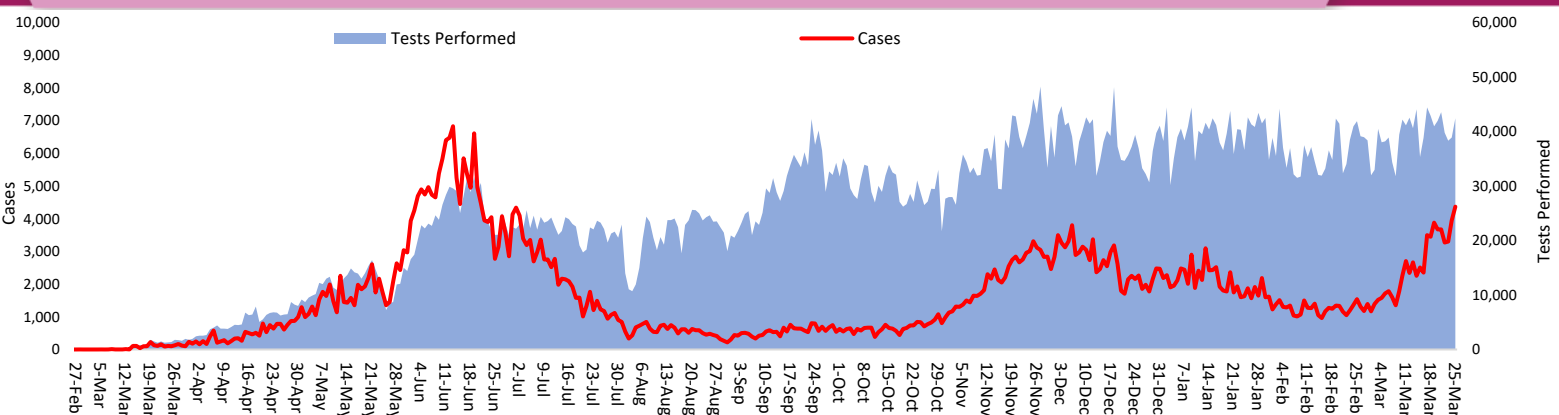

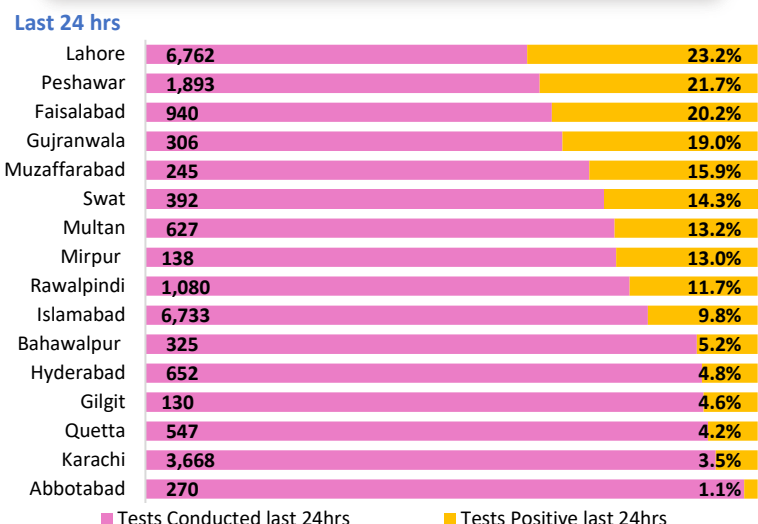

## MEETING AND COORDINATION



On 24<sup>th</sup> March 2021, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Provincial TB Control Program Punjab and Fatima Jinnah Medical University Lahore conducted a Seminar titled “Enhancing Partnership towards Ending TB” on the commemoration of World Tuberculosis (TB) Day 2021. WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala, Secretary Primary and Secondary Health care Punjab Ms Sarah Aslam, Vice chancellor, Fatima Jinnah Medical University, Prof. Amir Zaman Khan and Program Manager Provincial TB Control Program Punjab Dr Saeed Akhtar participated in the seminar. In his speech, WR highlighted that Pakistan carries the 5<sup>th</sup> highest burden of Tuberculosis in the world, with over half a million TB cases reported every year. WR stated that each year, we commemorate World Tuberculosis (TB) Day to raise public awareness about the devastating health, social and economic consequences of TB, and to step up efforts to end the global TB epidemic.
