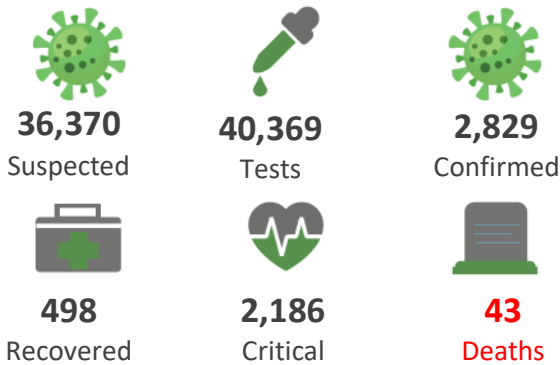


### TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



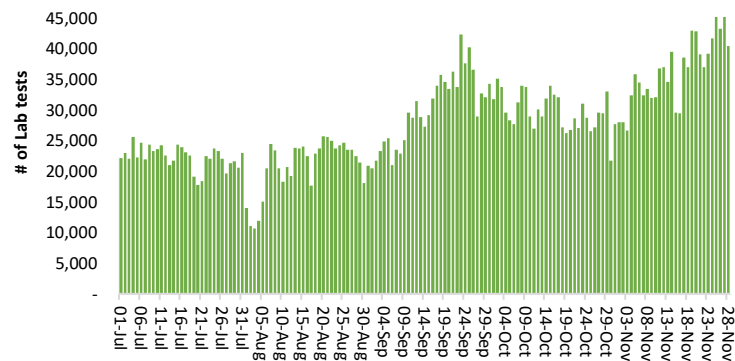
Pakistan reported **2,829** new cases of COVID-19 on **28 November 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **395,185** with **7,985** deaths (**CFR: 2.02%**). Out of the total **47,390** currently active cases, **2,682** cases are hospitalized.

### PAKISTAN UPDATES (Last 24hr)



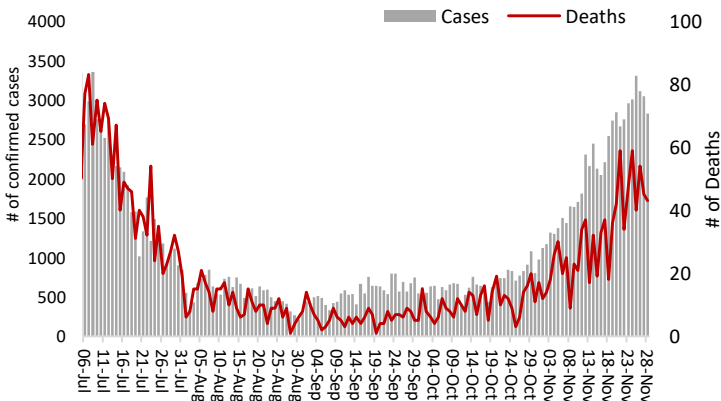

01-Jul to 28-Nov 2020

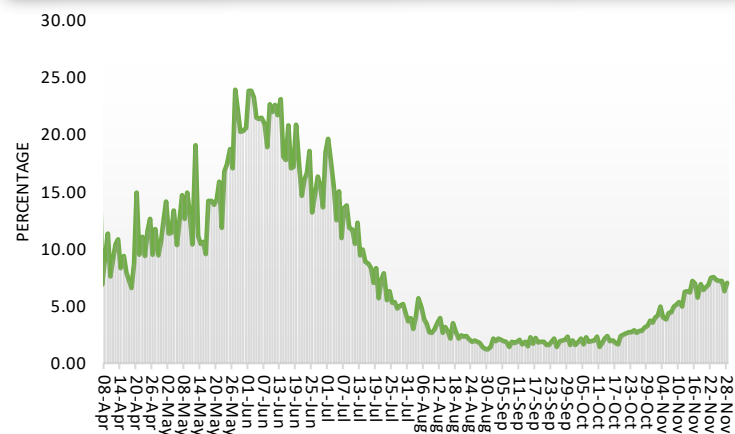


### INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE

## MEETINGS & COORDINATION

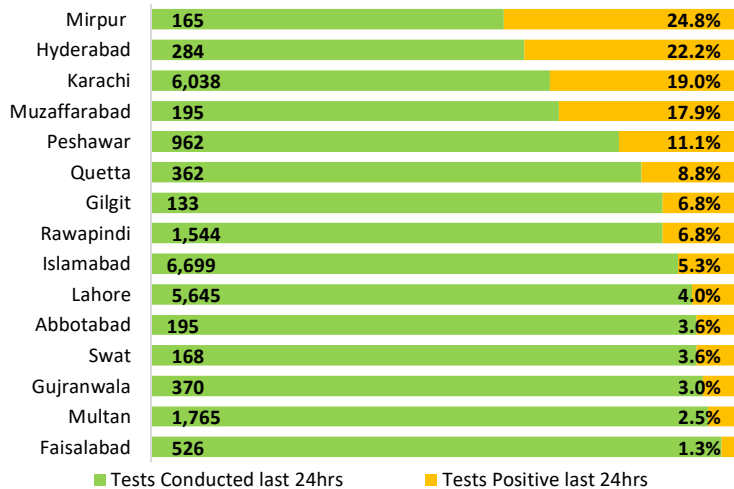
World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Population Welfare Department (PWD) conducted a two days' workshop from 24-25 November 2020 on Family Planning Techniques and IPC during COVID-19 pandemic in Hyderabad. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, essential services were affected. WHO is supporting the department of health Sindh in revitalizing the essential health services.

Five trainings on Family Planning services were planned at Regional Training Institutes (RTI) Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur and Larkana working under PWD. So far four trainings have been completed and 59 doctors working with PWD have successfully completed these trainings. The fifth session is planned at Larkana on 2-3 December 2020.

WHO also printed the PWD standard Family Planning guidelines manual for distribution among doctors working in clinics established by the department of PWD in the province.
