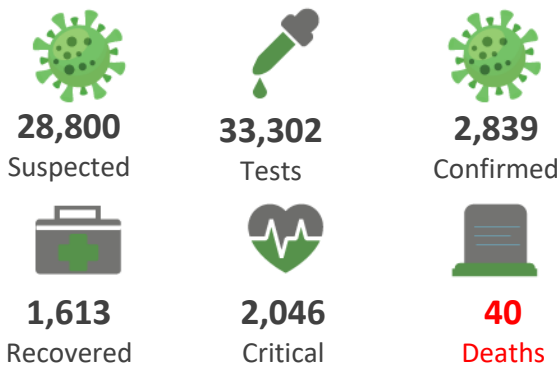


TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.

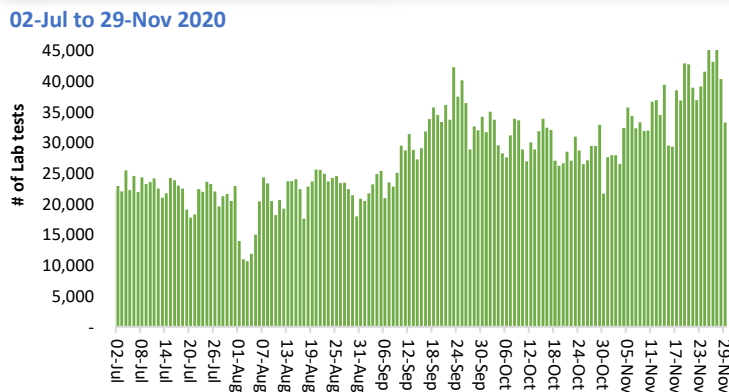


Pakistan reported **2,839** new cases of COVID-19 on **29 November 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **398,024** with **8,025** deaths (**CFR: 2.02%**). Out of the total **48,576** currently active cases, **2,543** cases are hospitalized.

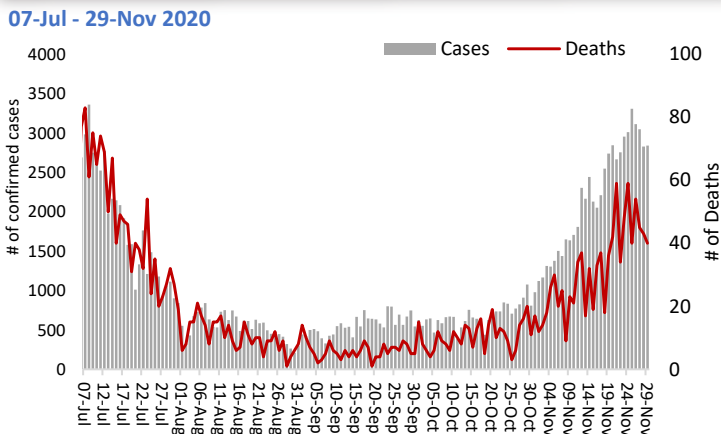

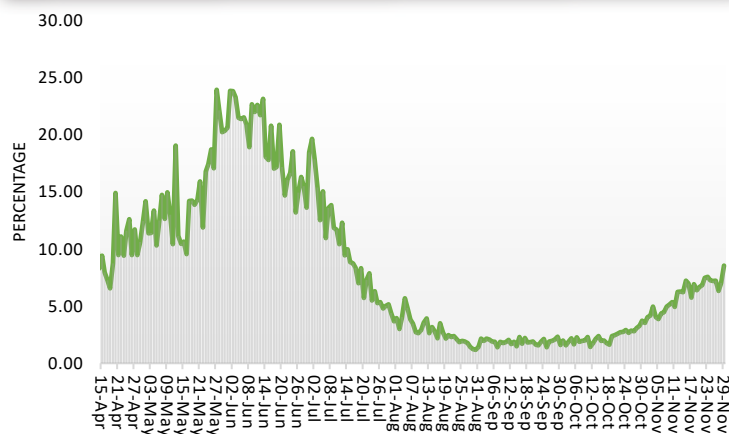
LAB TEST CONDUCTED BY DATE

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

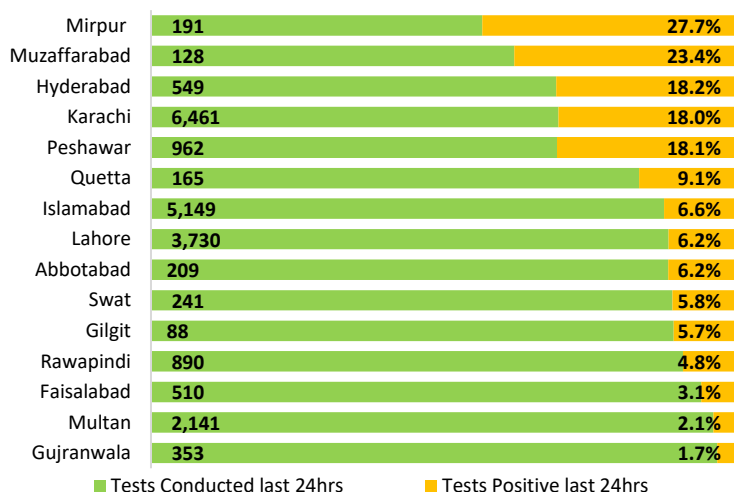


World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Provincial Health Department Sindh have conducted 8 training sessions on Early Essential Newborn Care (EENC) for labor room staff of three sites in district Larkana, Shaheed Benazir Abad and Jamshoro. Total 142 doctors, nurses and LHVs have completed the EENC training.

The objective of the training is to enhance skills in conducting quality care for the newborn immediately after delivery. Evidence have shown that by practicing EENC skills, newborn morbidities and mortalities have reduced. Pakistan is third country in EM Region where EENC is piloted and Sindh province is pioneering in this initiative. The Early Essential Newborn Care (EENC) was introduced in Pakistan in January 2020 with technical and financial support from WHO Regional Office. Three International Facilitators conducted 7 days training of trainers for 20 professionals at Shaikh Zaid Women Hospital Larkana.
