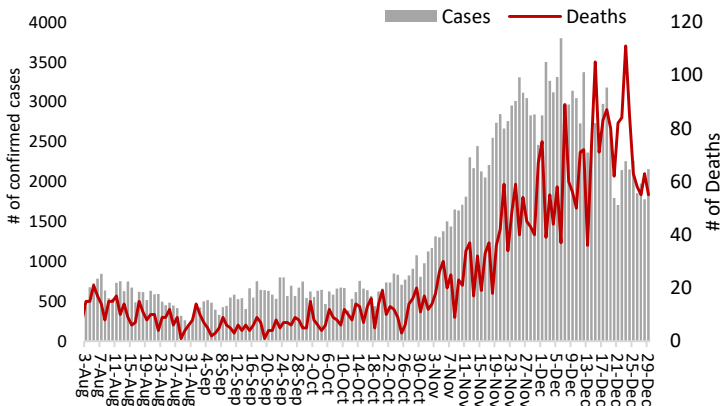

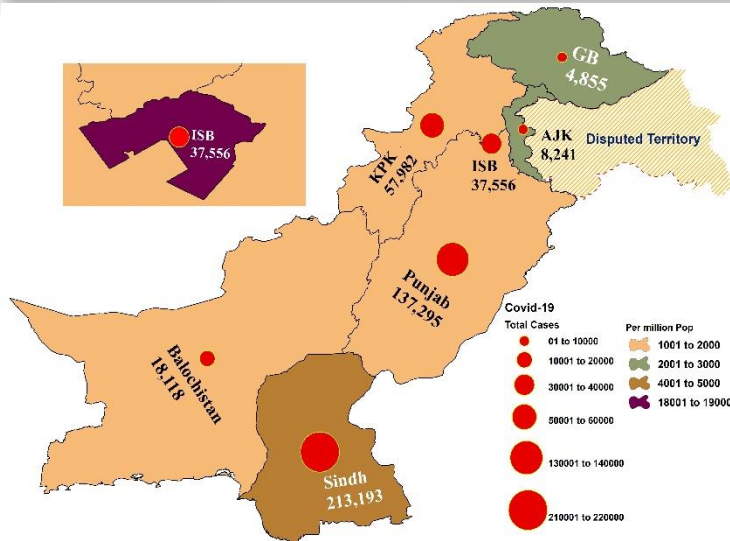


### INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE

03-Aug - 29-Dec 2020



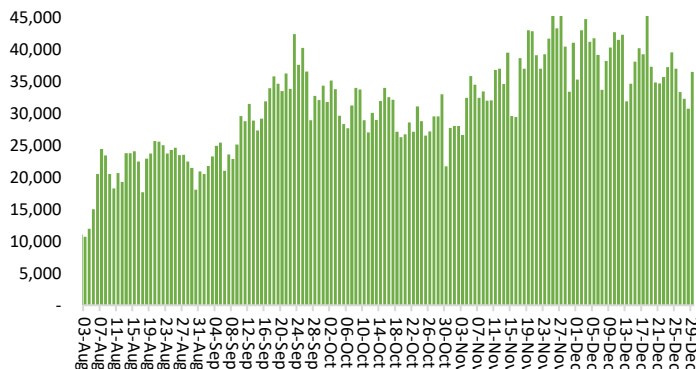
### TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



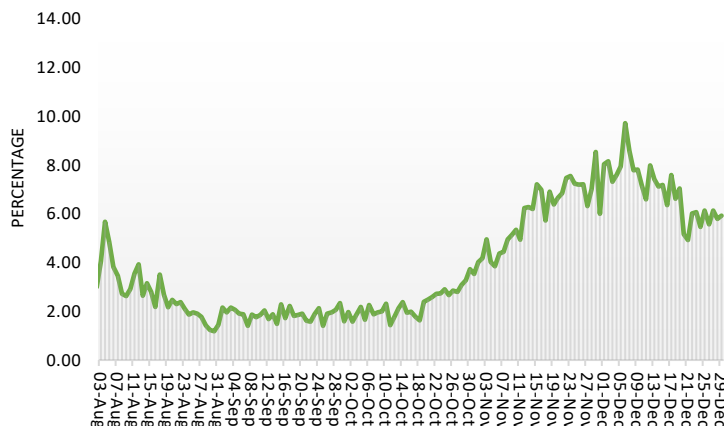
Pakistan reported **2,155** new cases of COVID-19 on **29 December 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **477,240** with **10,047** deaths (CFR: **2.10%**). Out of the total **37,080** currently active cases **2,714** cases are hospitalized.

## MEETINGS & COORDINATION

Today, 30<sup>th</sup> December 2020, WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala attended a Community awareness session on TB, held at Shah Allah Ditta Village in Islamabad. In his remarks, Dr Palitha appreciated the efforts of Deputy mayor Islamabad, Syed Zeeshan Ali Naqvi, District Health Officer Islamabad Dr Zaem Zia and Deputy National Coordinator (TB) Ministry of NHR&C, Dr Nasim Akhtar, for the TB free initiative in Islamabad.

The WHO supported initiative focuses on strengthening Primary Health Care (PHC) services through capacity building and community awareness activities for TB control. WR appreciated the essential role of Lady Health Workers (LHWs) and emphasized the importance of community engagement in the fight against TB. Under the initiative more than 300 LHWs have been trained for referring presumptive TB cases as well as TB contact tracing. TB free initiative Islamabad can serve as a model for scaling up similar initiatives in other parts of the country to make Pakistan TB free
